#### A Note from FHPC Board of Deacons:





### **Book Review | Althea Halchuck**

#### Two Versions: 1970 and 1999



The 23rd Psalm is one of the most famous passages of Scripture. Many have memorized it, and Christians almost always read it at memorial and graveside services. I grew up with the King James version, and that's one of the reasons I was drawn to W. Phillip Keller's A Shepherd Looks

at Psalm 23. David is the author of the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm, and he wrote this Psalm speaking as a sheep or as one Here are some relevant quotes: of the flock. There are two versions of this book in our library. The 1970 version is bound in brown leather and printed in black and white with charming etch-like illustrations by Robert Doares. The 1999 revised version has full-color illustrations, but I feel it lacks the simple charm of the earlier version.

The twelve chapters begin with "The Lord is My Shepherd" and end with "I Will Dwell in the House



of the Lord Forever." Phrase by phrase, Keller discusses the 23rd Psalm and draws on his eight years of experience as a sheep rancher in British Columbia to illustrate

how God is the Good Shepherd there to protect and guide us through difficult terrain. We are His mere sheep, dependent on Him for our every need. Keller uses his insights from his sheepherding days to show parallels between our life as Christians and our loving Shepherd caring for each of us and never letting even one of his sheep go astray. "God and man are those of a father to his children and a shepherd to his sheep."

Follow the author's admonition for the "reader to approach the pages with an open mind and unbiased spirit. If he does, fresh truth and exciting glimpses of God's care and concerns for him will flood over his being." This is an amazing book from both a spiritual and educational perspective. Keller cleverly weaves his knowledge and experience into each chapter. You will learn everything you need to know about the "sheep world" and how the shepherd must be proactive with his flock to maintain their security. As with sheep, there are many obstacles in life to overcome, and it is up to us to follow our Shepherd to avoid its ruts, pitfalls, and hazards. Always follow the Shepherd is good advice for sheep and Christians alike.

"Sheep do not 'just take care of themselves.' They require endless attention and meticulous care. From early dawn until late at night, this utterly selfless Shepherd is alert to the welfare of his flock. For him, there is no greater reward, no deeper satisfaction, than seeing his sheep contented, well-fed, safe, and flourishing under his care."

Our mass mind (or mob instincts), our fears and timidity, our stubbornness and stupidity, and our perverse habits are all parallels of profound importance."

There is not enough time in a short review to present much detail. You must experience this book for yourself. I guarantee you will never think about the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm (or sheep) in the same way after you read this treasure of a book.

Code: Red Water Drive sponsored by Phoenix Rescue



Mission will run through the end of August. Their goal is to send out 1,000,000 water bottles this summer. Last summer 645 lives were lost due to the extreme heat which is 52% over the year be-

fore. Lives are at risk this summer! No one is in more danger than our homeless neighbors. Together we can help save lives. Fountain Hills Presbyterian Church is the drop off place for our town wide water drive.

A check for \$1592.70 has been sent to Phoenix Res-

cue Code Red for water and more money has been donated. With the money and the cases of water that have been brought in, we have given



over 600 cases of water so far this summer. A big thank you to our FHPC family for your generosity. There are three ways to continue to support Code Red: You can bring water to the church and it will be picked up by Phoenix Rescue. The 24 - 16 OZ bottles are what they prefer. You can also contribute directly to Phoenix Rescue on their website at phoenixrescuemission.org/codered. You can also give directly to FHPC and put Code Red on the memo of your check or give cash in an envelope marked Code Red. Let's continue to support God's people in need with water during this extreme summer heat. Thank you.

#### **Community House**

The Mission committee voted to donate \$325 monthly

to Community House in Scottsdale to get food for the 3rd Monday in July and August. On Mondays, dinner is served at 5:00 provided by various churches and organizations. About 80-90 people are



served. Churches can bring the food and volunteers will serve it or they can stay to serve and talk with the guests or give money for the meal. The meal provided consists of an entree, rice or potato dish, bread, salad, and dessert. Community House provides the plates, etc. and setup. There is a kitchen with 3 stoves to heat food up. We hope to get a group together this fall to bring the food to Community House and help serve. Let the Mission Committee know if you are interested.


*O yes, it hurt me, but I still love you because I am your friend.*

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.


