have been a gift to all who have heard her play.



Year-to-date income exceeds YTD expenses by \$41,213. We have managed to stay within budget on the expense side. We had two air conditioners needing repair due to a power surge, which is always a concern during the hot summer months. Fortunately, this was covered under the church's property insurance policy. We were reimbursed \$10,045, net of our deductible. These funds were returned to the capital reserve account to be used for any future major capital repairs or purchases. Thank you for keeping up with your pledges and contributions for the ministry, missions, and operation of our church.


of hope from evangelist Will Graham. It is open to everyone, and all are welcome to attend.

Are You Connected?



The Story Behind "Amazing Grace"



Every week, millions of Christians around the world use hymns composed by believers from every era and branch of Christianity to join voices in praise—singing psalms and hymns and making melody in their hearts to praise the Lord. On a recent Sunday at FHPC, when we were singing the

beloved hymn "Amazing Grace," I wanted to revisit the circumstances of John Newton's composing this important message. In the church library, I located the book *Then Sings My Soul: 150 of the World's Greatest Hymn Stories* by Rev. Robert J. Morgan.

John Newton had been schooled in Christian beliefs by his mother, who unfortunately passed away when he was seven years old. After her death, he alternated between boarding school and the high seas, wanting to live a good life but nonetheless falling deeper into sin. He became involved in the slave trade. While on



a ship headed to England in 1748, a violent storm prompted him to change directions in his life and eventually change vocations to become a minister.

He became a successful preacher, wrote this autobiographical hymn in 1779, and went on to write a total of 349 hymns.

Each of the 150 hymns in this library book includes full sheet music and lyrics of the featured hymn on the left page, and on the opposite right page is the story behind its origin and how God stirred the hearts of the writers. These devotional-style stories show the emotion and drama behind the hymns of faith that have changed many lives throughout history—from the people whose faith led them to write these wonderful hymns to the people whose faith was affected by reading, hearing, and singing them. There is a hymn index for easy reference.

Christmas greeting note. Yes, that time of year has arrived.


Please remember that our Veterans and Troops Ministry is year -round—we never stop. We continue to

Meet Our Musicians | Debbie Fisher & Dorraine Aggen

My mother, Dorraine, has been playing the church organ and piano for fifty years and singing in church and choral ensembles all her life. All of her



Norwegian/German family sang in church, filling the pews of the little
Presbyterian Church behind her parents' home in a small town on the plains of South Dakota where they farmed and ran a garage that sold and repaired farming implements. Mom's beautiful mother sang soprano and her father was a bass. Mom and her two

brothers were happily raised playing and studying several different instruments to fill out the band and orchestra as very accomplished musicians, just as their parents did. There are several organists and pianists in Mom's family, including a brother, uncles and cousins, some university trained, some carrying on from the lessons they received in their youth and others playing by their natural ear. God spread the talents throughout the whole family.

Mom continued studying piano at Northern State while she also worked as a paralegal. Mom met my father, Charles, who was enlisted in the Air Force and was stationed in England. She took passage on the SS United States and began her life in England with my father. They had five children and traveled back to the states, then to Germany and back to the states again And they didn't lose any of us!

After my dad retired, we lived in Mountain Home, Idaho. We joined the church where Mom played the Allen Organ. She joined the Boise Master Chorale and treasures her memories of the hard work and many hours driving to Boise to sing the music of the masters. We always attended church, we always sang, we always played instruments as we learned them in school. A couple of us studied at University, another has become a legend in Idaho, traveling and singing his western songs.

After leaving Boise State I came to Arizona to continue my education at ASU for Music Therapy. While awaiting residency, I was employed as an

Associate teaching music all over the valley. For 14 years I taught in 10 schools a week. They were small and private schools and I loved it! I met my husband, Greg and we moved to Fountain Hills. Finally, I was back in a small town where everyone waved while driving! I began attending FHPC and decided fairly quickly that this was the place I wanted to be. I

me. Mom and Dad built a winter home here and we resumed small town living. Mom and I played in the FH Community Band together and played several ensembles together in church. I assumed the position of Director of Music Ministries in 2008. I have loved working in this church, with Dorothy Parris and several other folks who have been here just as long. I



play Taps for the Veterans and play at Memorial Day events, as I did as a teenager.

As a musician, I perform in several different ways in Fountain Hills. I have been on staff at our beautiful church for 31 years. Mom has been here 28 years. We both have been blessed with beautiful musical upbringings in beautiful

musical families. We have both been members of several performing groups that help to satisfy that musical passion we were born with. God has truly been directing our lives and the lives of all our family. He has blessed us with becoming a part of Fountain Hills.

Please call no later than the Monday prior to the first Sunday of the month.
