### FHPC COLUMBARIUM NICHE EXPANSION WE ARE GROWING!

The FHPC Columbarium was dedicated in 1990 following an ancient custom to have burial grounds near a home church. It consists of 276 secure niches where urns holding the ashes of

loved ones are interred. It is a final resting place for the cremains of many of our church members and friends. It is located in the shadow of the Memorial Bell Tower near the entrance to the Sanctuary and shaded by mesquite and olive trees. High above, the Carillon rings out beautiful and cherished hymns of faith. A lovely fountain, beautiful landscape, and memorial benches within the Columbarium offer a peaceful and sacred setting for reflection, prayer, and meditation. Surrounding the Columbarium is our Biblical Garden, which features plantings mentioned in sacred scriptures from the Bible. A heart-shaped, concrete walkway leads through and around the Garden, with signs indicating the names of plants with a corresponding Biblical verse. A brochure is available for a self-guided tour. I will devote an article to the Biblical Garden in a future issue of InTouch.


The Columbarium and Biblical Garden are managed by the Columbarium Trustees, a six-member committee of our church corporation elected by the Congregation for three-year terms. Current Trustees are Matt Jefferson (Chair,) Althea Halchuck, George Holtan, Dawn Lau, Bob Lull, and Jack Morris. The church does not fund or supplement the Columbarium in any way; it is fully self-sustaining. Management is provided solely by donations, niche subscriptions, memorial plaque reservations, and volunteer participation. A trust fund, managed by the Trustees, ensures proper maintenance and perpetual care of the Columbarium.

## **Clerk's Corner | Jack Reynolds**







### Library Footnotes | Barbara Oakeson

As our church celebrated 50 years this fall, we have looked back at where we came from along with looking towards our future together. So I decided to provide some history about how our church Library Resource Center got started and grew.



With the encouragement of the Presbyterian Women's group, volunteers (included anybody in the church interested in initiating a Church Library) met in 2005 to make plans and

move forward with the project. The initial committee members were Peggy Johnson, Jean Lorenz, Sandy Dettmering, Alice Berry, Holly Holmes, Lee Fisher, Chandler Dalbey, and Barbara Oakeson. After deciding a specific purpose and objectives for the Library Resource Center, we submitted a proposal to



session which was approved February 21, 2005. It probably helped that we were not asking for any funding yet, just making use of donated books!

Initially we were located in the conference room of the church offices where there were already some book shelves with some accumulated Christian books available for our use. But that room is used for many meetings and activities which meant scheduling conflicts. In 2007 a room in the Education building became available with more space which was an ideal location for us. Sandie Guiney was Christian



Education Director and most helpful in making the move happen. There wasn't any adult size furniture in the room so the challenge was

to furnish it with no funding. About that time the

attorney Stephanie Bivens (daughter in law of John and Mary Alice Bivens) moved her law office from Phoenix to Scottsdale, bought new furnishings, and offered the furniture she no longer needed



to us. All we had to do was send someone with a truck to pick it up and bring it to the church. Sandie made those arrangements and we acquired a nice conference table, five chairs, and a two piece L shaped desk that fit our needs beautifully above and beyond our expectations!

As the number of donated books continued to grow, we decided to explore some computer software programs for cataloging and processing our church library books



and other media. One of our committee members donated the funds to purchase Resource Mate 3.0 which had all the features we wanted at an affordable price. A winter visitor donated a nice book cart. At Donna Yordy's suggestion in 2008, the Presbyterian Women's group began having a Book Shower at one of their gatherings each year to acquire books on the

annual PW Reading List as well as buy books on topics that we didn't have but needed, achieving more balance in our Library collection. As our operational needs for funding grew, we became part of the church budget and either someone or a small group stepped up to the plate with the financial support we needed to grow. We feel that our Library ministry is a way



to touch lives, enrich faith journeys, and send God's amazing message into the world.

## Support Our Troops | Donna Sims



Well, the very busy months of October and November continued into December and I can now truly say that I am 90% done as of this writing, with everything that falls under our Veterans and our Troops mission projects. With the donations of New Testaments by Men's Fellowship, my Christmas Card project doubled in time and size but I did

manage to figure out how to package and send them off, which I did last week. Boy, did I create a long line at the post office because it did take them quite some time to process all of the packages and send me out the door.



In addition to the Christmas card packages, I was also able to schedule a pick-up from Community Bridges to come to my garage. Boy, were they ever surprised, as I was, that these particular bundles of donations turned into my largest ever. Everything from men's and women's clothing to bedding, toiletries, kitchen items, furniture, a flat screen TV,

and ended with some snacks. Upon leaving my garage, they were headed straight for one of their shelters. Many sincere thanks to all of you who made donations.



And again, I kindly ask that everyone remember that our Veterans and Troops Ministry is year-round, it never stops. We continue to collect gently used clothing, bedding, socks, shoes, hats, jackets, sweatshirts, long pants, small household items and most of all, toiletries. We are always happy to see Church members and friends from our community placing items in our collection box, located in the Narthex on the East side and in the Church office. Thank you again for remembering our Veterans and our Troops. Here is wishing each one of you a happy and healthy New Year. Can't believe it's 2025. Wow.

# Matt Jefferson & Althea Halchuck | Columbarium Update

#### (Continued from Front Cover)

The Columbarium is not restricted to church members but is available to anyone, with advanced approval from the Trustees. The subscription price was last raised 20 years ago. After surveying the local area church niche prices and availability, in early 2024, the Trustees voted to increase our niche price from \$700 to \$1,250. The subscription fee includes the \$250 brass nameplate created at the time of interment, a Veteran's medallion, along with maintenance in perpetuity.

There were 276 niches initially, but by the Fall of 2024, we had only six remaining. Fountain Hills did not want to pursue creating a Columbarium for the town, so the Trustees voted to expand our Columbarium by adding 32 niches. Our expansion goals were to maximize the number of niches, minimize the footprint, maintain the quality, and make it affordable. We received three bids for various designs and locations. They included adding niches around the Memorial Flagpole and under the fountain, which was neither practical nor aesthetically pleasing. After much deliberation, the Trustees approved the bid for 32 niches from the original niche company, Matthews' Mausoleum. We knew they would provide the same quality and design as before, and their price was affordable. Minimizing the footprint was the most challenging goal.

The new niches will be located directly across from Section "A," creating a mirror image to match the existing wall. This project has many moving parts, including removing a tree and some shrubs. We have a bid for masonry work to remove the brick wall and form a structure to insert the bank of 32 niches. A tile company will match the existing tile and encase the new niches identical to those in Section "A." We expect to start installation within a few months, have stayed within our budget, and have adhered to our list of goals. We welcome questions as we progress, so please contact any Trustee for information and updates.

There are opportunities


